Tell us in a few hundred words which Camp you were at and what you got up to at camp?

We had a camper in session 4, that was negative about everything to do with camp, she would refuse to follow the rules and would curse in front of other campers, we struggled for the good part of a week trying to guide her and it seemed as though we were failing. Then one day when we were all leaving the cabin for dinner, she walked out the door behind me, there was still a few girls in the cabin, we got about 25 meters away from the cabin and she told me to wait, she turned around and ran back to outside the cabin and says 'Girls, don't forget to turn off the lights'. That moment, it was like the week of hard work was finally rewarding. She ended up not wanting to go home and is planning on coming back next year!

Was there a camper that stands out in your mind? If so why?

There was a camper in Session 3 and 4 that was amazing. She was the friendliest girl and was always enthusiastic. On change day she was amazing with the new girls that came and would always put others before herself. She worked hard in her swimming classes and was never negative! She was really incredible!

Do you have any advice for someone who wants an American adventure?

If you're thinking about it, go for it! It was the most amazing experience of my life and I have made so many amazing friendships along the way. Words can't describe how you feel while you're there and the changes it makes to you as a person!
